Knowledge Management John T. Janiszewski, Army War College (U.S.). 2011 In today's volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous (VUCA) environment, it is essential that organizations share and exploit the knowledge contained within the organization. This is especially true for large, highly complex organizations such as combatant commands. An organization that creates a culture that encourages collaboration and knowledge sharing with formal knowledge management (KM) principles is more likely to achieve success in the operational environment. Adopting and applying the Army's 12 principles for KM will enable Combatant Commands to create a collaborative, learning organization that more effectively execute its mission. This paper explores KM as a critical enabler for combatant commands using the Army's twelve principles for KM. Additionally, this paper explores deficiencies in the application of KM in current operations, focusing on intelligence/information sharing, situational awareness and knowledge codification. Finally, this paper provides recommendations on a KM model that Combatant Commands can leverage to execute effectively its warfighter mission.

Implementation of an Army General Officer Knowledge Management System

Robert M. Sheppard, Army War College (U.S.), 2004 Knowledge is a key enabler which provides organizations and individuals information dominance. This in turn allows the organization and individuals to become relevant and ready through the use of knowledge. However converting tacit to explicit knowledge and utilizing this knowledge throughout the spectrum of an organization has become a challenge for commercial and government entities. General officers within the United States Army possess a plethora of tacit knowledge at the strategic operational and tactical level. However the majority of this knowledge is not captured within a system where present and future general officers can benefit from its existence. In order to rectify this problem the Army must develop and implement a general officer knowledge management system. This system must allow general officers the ability to share search and disseminate

explicit knowledge via the Internet. Additionally the architecture associated with this knowledge management system must be a seamless part of day-to-day operations for general officers whose operational tempo is twenty four hours a day seven days a week. Establishing this system will provide United States Army general officers the ability to transform themselves into true knowledge based individuals that will have a great impact on the Army as an organization.

Army Science Board 2001 AD HOC Study "Knowledge Management." .2001 The Army Science Board was tasked to conduct a study on Knowledge Based Management and Information Reliability to examine innovative ways of addressing technology issues that have the potential to weigh down future warfighters with massive amounts of data. Specific subtaskings include: (1) Define Knowledge Management and Information Assurance technologies for the Objective Force; (2) Define the strategy for conquering information glut through fundamental soldier/team enabling technologies and processes from conceptual to geo-spatial; (3) Examine technology and operational concepts to mitigate asymmetric threats; (4) Provide a 2008-2012 roadmap to enable small, autonomous processing that facilitates knowledge production, sharing and decision making. The ASB central recommendation is to incorporate and grow KM in the IBCTs. Other recommendations include: (1) Designation of KM and Info Assurance technologies as essential for Knowledge Dominance; (2) Building tactical Knowledge Management on the foundation of the existing Army Knowledge Online, the Army's excellent enterprise application; (3) Establish doctrine incorporating KM & IA technologies into Objective Force systems, including OF Combat Battalion and OF Soldier Systems; (4) Implementing a KM Center of Excellence (ARL & TRADOC); and (5) Investing in Process, Technology and Training to ensure Knowledge Dominance.

Knowledge Management in an Information Age Army Darrell D.

Fountain, Army War College (U.S.). 2007 The widespread application of advanced information technologies has dramatically affected United States fighting forces. Senior leaders at all levels that came of age as principals before the technological revolution of the 90's have struggled to take full advantage of modern information technology. Information technology exploitation strategies have been further complicated by the now omnipresent Joint and Combined nature of our operations. Key leaders need to more fully embrace the comprehensive strategy already available to take full advantage of this explosion in capability. This regulation establishes policies and assigns responsibilities

for the management of information resources and information technology (IT). Robertson.2007 This study addresses the question of whether knowledge management is an appropriate strategy for revising the Army doctrine development process in the contemporary operational environment (COE). The author applies knowledge management theory to the proposed web-based Army Field Manual (FM) 7-1, Battle Focused Training, and then to the Army's overall doctrine development process. The results show that knowledge management provides only a partial solution to the problems of consistency and timeliness in the doctrine development process, and that knowledge management cannot solve the problem of validating and testing doctrine. He concludes that only if the doctrine development process is revised in accordance with the principles of knowledge management and Chris Argyris' theory of double-loop learning will the problems of validation, consistency, and timeliness of doctrine development be solved.

(JP 3-0) Based on the situation, commanders organize their mission command system (personnel, networks, information systems, processes and procedures, facilities and equipment) into CPs to assist them in the exercise of mission command. Headquarters have evolved throughout military history. In the nineteenth century, Napoleon recognized that a headquarters that provided the planning and analytic capability for a campaign was too large to use in battle. He exercised command through a smaller grouping brought forward from the larger headquarters. By World War II, U.S. Army doctrine clearly specified dividing an organization's headquarters into two echelons: forward and rear. AirLand Battle doctrine of the 1980s to the late 1990s focused on an echeloned threat and a linear battlefield. Units echeloned their headquarters into a rear CP, main CP, and tactical CP. In 2003, the Army undertook a fundamental shift from a division-based force toward a brigade-based force. Army transformation and modularity significantly modified the roles and organization of division through theater Army headquarters to include eliminating the rear CP. The

relatively fixed nature of operations following major combat in Iraq and Afghanistan led to units establishing large, static, and complex CPs. Units often operated from a single and fixed CP within a forward operating base. While this technique was appropriate to the situations in Iraq and Afghanistan, Army forces must be prepared to operate across the range of military operations to include fast paced and large scale combat operations over great distances. As such, headquarters must be capable of deploying, constructing, camouflaging and concealing, operating, echeloning, positioning, and displacing CPs rapidly in austere environments. To reduce deployment time and increase the mobility, agility, and survivability of CPs, the Army is currently modifying CP organization for division and corps headquarters. Division and corps headquarters are in the process of converting their headquarters to operate from a home station CP and forward CP. This publication provides a framework for the employment of this new design in appendix E. The ability to conduct effective CP operations is essential for a headquarters to sustain continuous operations. Commanders and staffs develop command post SOPs that address staff organization, CP layouts, knowledge management, battle rhythm, planning, battle drills, security and life support. Commanders ensure their staffs are trained on CP operations and direct revisions to the SOP as required. This publication provides techniques and best practices to assist commanders and staffs in organizing, employing, and operating CPs.
