The broker who negotiated the sale from Miller to Belmonte, in 1838, testified in Court that he then thought, and still thought, that the girl was white! The case was elaborately argued on both sides, but was at length decided in favour of the girl, by the Supreme Court declaring that she was free and white, and therefore unlawfully held in bondage. The Rev. George Bourne, of Virginia, in his *Picture of Slavery*, published in 1834, relates the case of a white boy who, at the age of seven, was stolen from his home in Ohio, tanned and stained in such a way that he could not be distinguished from a person of colour, and then sold as a slave in Virginia. At the age of twenty, he made his escape, by running away, and happily succeeded in rejoining his parents. I have known worthless white people to sell their own free children into slavery; and, as there are good-for-nothing white as well as coloured persons[...].
