L'auteur y oppose le calme bonheur d'un ménage honnête formé par Lévine et Kitty Chtcherbatski aux humiliations et aux déboires qui accompagnent la passion coupable d'Alexis Vronski et d'Anna Karénine ; les premiers brouillons étaient d'ailleurs intitulés Deux mariages, deux couples. Anna Karénine met en scène la noblesse russe, sur laquelle Tolstoï porte un regard critique. Le personnage d'Anna Karénine aurait été en partie inspiré de Maria Hartung (1832-1919), la fille aînée du poète Alexandre Pouchkine.

Utopia's Garden E. C. Spary.2010-12-15 The royal Parisian botanical garden, the Jardin du Roi, was a jewel in the crown of the French Old Regime, praised by both rulers and scientific practitioners. Yet unlike many such institutions, the Jardin not only survived the French Revolution but by 1800 had become the world's leading public establishment of natural history: the Muséum d'Histoire Naturelle. E. C. Spary traces the scientific, administrative, and political strategies that enabled the foundation of the Muséum, arguing that agriculture and animal breeding rank alongside classification and collections in explaining why natural history was important for French rulers. But the Muséum's success was also a consequence of its employees' Revolutionary rhetoric: by displaying the natural order, they suggested, the institution could assist in fashioning a self-educating, self-policing Republican people. Natural history was presented as an indispensable source of national prosperity and individual virtue. Spary's fascinating account opens a new chapter in the history of France, science, and the Enlightenment.

Penser les réseaux Daniel Parrochia.2001 Depuis plusieurs années maintenant, la notion de réseau connaît la faveur du grand public et des médias : on veut voir des réseaux partout, on veut mettre des réseaux partout. Au-delà de la mode, des utopies, des rêves, il y a à cela plusieurs raisons valables. Re-Reading Zola and Worldwide Naturalism Marie-Sophie Armstrong, Riikka Rossi, Carolyn Snipes-Hoyt.2013-07-26 Re-Reading Zola and Worldwide Naturalism continues the discussion of Émile Zola and French naturalism with examinations of unexplored areas of the founding father's project and legacy. In addition to offering essays on Zola's lesser known naturalist contemporaries, the volume extends the investigation of the naturalist literary current to include areas of Europe outside France, as well as the Americas and Asia, tracking its persistence in various forms through

the twentieth century and into the twenty-first. The authors pay particular attention to the ways naturalism was conceived and then received, including in other channels, undergoing transformations in new social conditions and creating other versions of the basic precepts. This work features multidisciplinary and comparative approaches to the study of naturalism, paying tribute to Anna Gural-Migdal—a Professor of French Literature and Film Studies at the University of Alberta, in Canada, who specializes in the visual aspect of Zola's Rougon Macquart novels and the transfer of these strategies to naturalist film. She has been a leader in the field of Zola and naturalism in her role as president of the AIZEN for almost fifteen of its twenty years of existence.

Life - The Outburst of Life in the Human Sphere Anna-Teresa Tymieniecka.2013-03-09 Science and philosophy have both undergone radical transformations in recent times. Now they are poised for a pivotal alliance. Science has abandoned the mechanistic model of nature. Philosophy has broken through the tight, traditional circle of conceptualisation, intellectualistic preconceptions and cognitive presuppositions. The two now meet to focus on the palpating, fluctuating stream of nature/life. Their traditional prejudices dispersed under the pressure of new evidence, philosophy/phenomenology of life and the sciences of life meet in the Archimedean point of the human creative condition (proper to the phenomenology of life) and the role of the human subject (central to the scientific view of reality). They necessitate each other: without the sciences of life, philosophy/phenomenology of life cannot penetrate the intricacies of nature/life; without recourse to philosophy to delineate, design, provide clues to the organisation of natural evidence, the sciences of life cannot devise new strategies for inquiry nor survey their field. The present collection throws open the barriers that separate nature and culture, works of physis and those of the spirit. Following the philosophical model of the ontopoiesis of life, focusing on its specifically human sphere - that of the human self-interpretation-in-existence - it encircles the vast, new horizons of the new alliance.

Sotise a huit personnages [Le Nouveau Monde] Olga Anna Duhl.2005 La Sotise a huit personnages, composée à Toulouse vers 1507, est une pièce essentielle pour saisir le jeu complexe du pouvoir et la culture à l'époque pré-républicaine de l'absolutisme. Véritable somme de la production dramatique du début du XVI^e siècle, la Sotise se munit des armes de la folie et de la satire pour dé fendre les privilèges de l'Eglise gallicane aux dépens des représentants du pouvoir, y compris Louis XII et son ministre, le cardinal d'Amboise. Nonobstant sa virulence, elle parvient à se faire imprimer à Paris, assortie d'autres textes de propagande, à la faveur du conflit qui oppose le roi et Jules II. Amendant l'édiction qu'en procura l'éminent philologue Emile Picot, Olga A. Duhl en donne une nouvelle, fondée sur le seul imprimé connu (BnF Ms. Yf 2934), qu'elle complète d'un appareil critique substantiel, d'une introduction historique, littéraire et linguistique, d'un glossaire analytique, d'un index des noms propres et d'une bibliographie complète. Elle formule une hypothèse inédite concernant la question, toujours d'actualité, du genre et de la paternité littéraire de la Sotise : voilà une adaptation où s'entremêlent sottie, moralité, farce et mystère, ainsi qu'une riche palette de formes poétiques, qui a - bénéficié de la contribution d'un poète-basochien toulousain, tel que Blaise d'Auriol, et non pas une sottie parisienne composée par le rhétoricien André de La Vigne, comme le postulait Picot. Représentant de l'idéologie conservatrice de l'Université, Blaise d'Auriol fut aussi lauréat des Jeux floraux, dont la Sotise constitue précisément une variante parodique. Mais c'est surtout par la mise en scène d'un Nouveau Monde que s'impose la Sotise, assumant le statut d'une utopie politique qui préfigure celles de la Renaissance.

Decentering Comparative Analysis in a Globalizing World .2021-10-18 Decentering Comparative Analysis in a Globalizing World aims to go beyond the traditional criticism in comparative analysis. It wants to shed new light on the question of comparing as a form of categorizing. Discourses on Nations and Identities Daniel Syrový.2021-01-18 The third volume of the collected papers of the ICLA congress The Many Languages of Comparative Literature includes contributions that focus on the interplay between concepts of nation, national languages, and individual as well as collective identities. Because all literary communication happens within different kinds of power structures - linguistic, economic, political -, it often results in fascinating forms of hybridity. In the first of four thematic chapters, the papers investigate some of the ways in which discourses can establish modes of thinking, or how discourses are in turn controlled by active linguistic interventions, whether in the context of the patriarchy, war, colonialism, or political factions. The second thematic block is predominantly concerned with hybridity as an aspect of modern cultural identity, and the cultural and linguistic dimensions of domestic life and in society at large. Closely related, a third series of papers focuses on writers and texts analysed from the vantage points of exile and exophony, as well as theoretical contributions to issues of terminology and what it means to talk about transcultural phenomena. Finally, a group of papers sheds light on more overtly violent power structures, mechanisms of exclusion, Totalitarianism, torture, and censorship, but also resistance to these forms of oppression. In addition to these chapters, the volume also collects a number of thematically related group sections from the ICLA congress, preserving their original context.

European Literary Immigration Into the French Language Tijana Miletić.2008 The critical, emotional and intellectual change which every immigrant is obliged to endure and confront is experienced with singular intensity by immigrant writers who have also adopted another language for their literary expression. Concentrating on European authors of the second half of the twentieth century who have chosen French as a language for their literary expression, and in particular the novels by Romain Gary, Agota Kristof, Milan Kundera and Jorge Semprun, with reference to many others, European Literary Immigration into the French Language explores some of the common elements in these works of fiction, which despite the varied personal circumstances and literary aesthetics of the authors, follow a similar path in the building of a literary identity and legitimacy in the new language. The choice of the French language is inextricably linked with the subsequent literary choices of these writers. This study charts a new territory within Francophone and European literary studies in treating the European immigrants as a separate group, and in applying linguistic, sociological and psychoanalytical ideas in the analysis of the works of fiction, and thus represents a relevant contribution to the understanding of European cultural identity. Lecture plurielle de l'oeuvre de Christa Wolf Martine Schnell.2004-05-31 Cette étude analyse l'œuvre de Christa Wolf autour de la thématique du mythe, de l'utopie et du féminisme. L'archétype y définit le calque d'un modèle littéraire, fait référence à des faits inhérents à l'œuvre et est un élément mythologique essentiel. Le mythe s'analyse d'après Cassandre et Médée, deux textes majeurs de Christa Wolf. On envisagera une lecture féminine en établissant une typologie des personnages romanesques. L'œuvre est resituée dans le champ des influences de prédécesseurs ou d'auteurs contemporains des dix-neuvième et vingtième siècles. L'objectif principal consiste à déceler des influences marquantes dans le processus d'écriture de Christa Wolf ainsi que le paysage littéraire d'Allemagne de l'Est. Comparative Literary History as Discourse Mario J. Valdés, Daniel Javitch, Alfred Owen Aldridge. 1992 This volume is a Festschrift in honor of the scholar who has been a leader in the renewal of Comparative Literature as a major discipline. However, the papers in this collection are also a celebration of the discipline that has been the passion of Anna Balakian's life: the rigorous, scrupulous, uncompromisingly logical study of literary history across cultural barriers. This volume is also literary history as discourse because the contributors examine and question the enterprise itself. As a collection these essays comprise a searching assessment of the present state of the discipline.

Danièle Sallenave et le don des morts Bruno Thibault. 2022-07-04 Ce volume contient le première étude consacrée à l'oeuvre complète de Danièle Sallenave. Les trois premiers chapitres examinent 'l'éthique du roman' définie par Sallenave contre le formalisme des années 50-60. Ils soulignent les apories de la temporalité dans les premiers romans de l'auteur et mettent en relief les traits qui y opposent temps existentiel et temps historique, temps masculin et temps féminin, temps messianique et temps médiatique. Le chapitre 4, intitulé "Féminisme et postféminisme", examine la représentation de la féminité dans le corpus sallénave. Ce chapitre montre d'abord comment l'émancipation proposée par le féminisme universaliste et la transgression rêvée par le féminisme différentialiste s'opposent point par point chez plusieurs personnages. Ce chapitre étudie ensuite l'alliance nécessaire de la critique sociale à la théorie psychanalytique pour bien définir la condition féminine dans *Vie fantôme*. Le chapitre discute enfin la violente polémique qui a opposé Danièle Sallenave à Julia Kristeva et à Sylviane Agacinski à propos du débat sur la 'parité' à la fin des années 90. Le chapitre 5 étudie les journaux de voyage de Sallenave dans les pays de l'Est, puis en Palestine et en Inde. Ce chapitre montre d'une part les difficultés rencontrées par l'auteur pour aboutir à une représentation authentique du tiers-monde. Ce chapitre discute d'autre part l'importance de définir un nouvel humanisme à l'heure de la globalisation: un humanisme universaliste et engagé, basé sur les droits de l'homme et de la femme, bien distinct de l'eurocentrisme d'antan. Le chapitre 6 étudie la métaphore de 'l'accélération de l'histoire dans *Trois Minutes du diable*. L'analyse détaillée de ce 'roman polyphonique' permet de définir une écriture du temps vivant adaptée au siècle nouveau.

Life M. Kronegger, Anna-Teresa Tymieniecka. 2012-12-06 In her Introduction, Tymieniecka states the core theme of the present book sharply: Is culture an excess of nature's prodigious expansiveness - an excess which might turn out to be dangerous for nature itself if it goes too far - or is culture a 'natural', congenial prolongation of nature-life? If the latter, then culture is assimilated into nature and thus would lose its claim to autonomy: its criteria would be superseded by those of nature alone. Of course, nature and culture may both still be seen as being absorbed by the inner powers of specifically human inwardness, on which view, human being, caught in its own transcendence, becomes separated radically in kind from the rest of existence and may not touch even the shadow of reality except through its own prism. Excess, therefore, or prolongation? And on what terms? The relationship between culture and nature in its technical phase demands a new elucidation. Here this is pursued by excavating the root significance of the 'multiple rationalities' of life. In contrast to Husserl, who differentiated living types according to their degree of participation in the world, the phenomenology of life disentangles living types from within the onto-poietic web of life itself.
