This WSC 2008 is the thirteenth conference in this series and it has been a

great success. We received a lot of excellent paper submissions which were peer-reviewed by an international team of experts. Only 60 papers out of 111 submissions were selected for online publication. This assured a high quality standard for this online conference. The corresponding online statistics are a proof of the great world-wide interest in the WSC 2008 conference. The conference website had a total of 33,367 different human user accesses from 43 countries with around 100 visitors every day, 151 people signed up to WSC to discuss their scientific disciplines in our chat rooms and the forum.
